We'd like to take this opportunity to again thank Friedrike for making this important event possible through her initiative, creativity, and generosity.



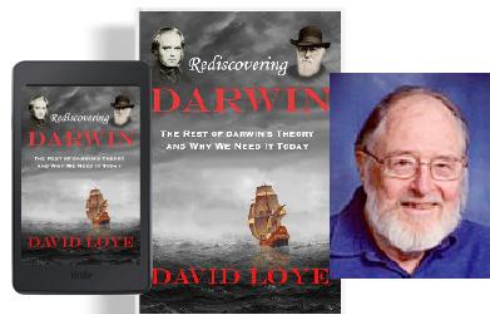
